Lesson Plan Title: Linoleum Block Printing

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Concept/ Topic to Teach: How to create prints using Linoleum

Standards Addressed: AH-8-SA-S-VA2 Students will use the elements of art, principle of design, and a variety of processes in creating artworks. AH-08-1.4.2 Students will compare or evaluate a variety of art media and art processes.

Art Processes:

DOK 2

<u>Two-dimensional</u> – drawing, painting, fiber art (fabric printing, stamping, tie-dye), printmaking

"I Can" Statements: I can create a linoleum block design using tools. I can make multiple prints using the linoleum block .

Specific Objectives: Students will create a linoleum block and a series of 3 prints. Students will sign and number prints.

Vocabulary: linoleum block, printing ink, brayer

Required Materials: linoleum, carving tools, table guard, brayer, ink, inking plate, paper.

Step by Step Procedure:

- 1. Teacher will show prints and tools. Teacher will demonstrate how to carve the linoleum. Safety procedures will be emphasized.
- 2. Students will trace the linoleum and draw their design using a pencil. When the design is approved by the teacher then the student will transfer the design to the linoleum by pressing it against the linoleum.
- 3. Students will place safety guards on table and then carve linoleum designs.
- 4. Teacher will check final design to make sure it is deep enough and has enough design
- 5. Teacher will demonstrate how to make a series of 3 prints..
- 6. Student will go to the printing station and make a series of 3 prints.
- 7. Prints will be titled, numbered and signed the following day.

Assessment:

Informal assessment will be questions asked at end or beginning of class. Formal assessment will be critique of finished product or comparison of printing processes. Rubric and Comparison attached.
