Significant Past State Activities – March 2012–March 2013:

- The US DOE invited NMAEA to exhibit in their rotating gallery in August. 70 student pieces were selected and exhibited. Phyllis and Michelle attended with Deborah Reeve.
- Our Bylaws were edited to reflect a rotating turnover of BOD positions with elections now every year for half of the positions thus ensuring better history and improved leadership.
- Policies and Procedures are being written as a working document.
- Establishing the working budget and working calendar has streamlined our efficiency and accountability.
- The PED state art teacher list was updated and now part of our Policies and Procedures for annual updating.
- Our annual state art education conference was held in Santa Fe, NM with a slightly lower attendance. Ken Vieth was keynote, thanks to Davis, with noted attendance and workshops by TAEA Cheryl Evans. Our awards program continued into it's second year.
- Our financial housekeeping continues to evolve, adding the state attorney general's office as part of our annual reports. All past records have now been uploaded and reported improving our accountability.
- The website continues to be the cornerstone of the association's communication with members as well as monthly president's letters which have replaced the newsletter program.
- Three key outreach meetings took place launching our intent to build regional networks within the state.
- Legislative advocacy was again paramount this year with teacher evaluations at the forefront. Responses from the arts community stopped key bills again this year.
- NMAEA was selected to jury the At large regional for Scholastic Art Awards. We received a commitment from the National Hispanic Cultural Center (NHCC) as well as a grant from the Albert I Pierce Foundation.
- Our YAM contest is now sponsored by Sargent Arts.

Significant Planned State Activities – March 2012–March 2013:

We plan to improve the programs we have already started and future program growth is on hold.

- Launch statewide Scholastics program.
- YAM to include Sargent Arts at State Fair art exhibit.
- Continue regional development specifically in SW and SE.

Learning—develop effective leadership, teaching and advocacy for art education:

Leadership: Annual January strategic planning leadership meeting with BOD trains new board – Budget is posted for membership. BOD is developing policies and procedures. Delegate's attendance to NAEA National's & Regional meeting.

Teaching: Increased pre-service student involvement, discounts to workshops and conference. Conference lesson plans are on the website. Collage credit for conference and summer master class attendance.

Community—build a professional community:

- Continued outreach at regional meetings, summer master class, and fall conference.
- Developing donors program similar to NDI.
- Growing state wide student recognitions and art exhibits/ activities and programs.
- Communication through growing website, continued membership emails, monthly president's letter, and Facebook blogs.
- Recognition of outstanding excellence in visual art through Awards program and Merit Awards.
- Developing relationships with state art organizations such as NM Arts, the NM Music Association, NMACAE, FAEA, and RMCAD.

Research/Knowledge—assess programs/services and provide access to information on policy:

- Strategic panning is in year 2 of a 3 year NMAEA Strategic plan.
- Currently developing policy and procedures as it pertains to NMAEA.
- Constitution and Bylaws and budget are posted on website along with BOD biographies. BOD minutes will be added.
- Division level meetings and technology block are added to conference schedule.
- Division directors are researching state art teacher data.

Advocacy—communicate the value of visual arts:

- Past president is now the Awards chair as well as the Advocacy Chair on our BOD.
- New Awards program developed for art teachers. Student awards were increased.
- President serves on the NM Advisory Council on Arts Education (NMACAE).
- Advocacy information is on our website including NAEA, NMAEA and state legislative information.
- Advocacy information is forwarded to membership via personal email.
- Advocacy materials and information are provided at our conferences and regional outreach meetings.

Other new information from your State:
